

North Carolina Re-entry Procedures

State of North Carolina

The statewide Re-Entry Certification Program is administered and managed by the North Carolina Department of Public Safety, Division of Emergency Management (NCEM), Private Sector/BEOC.

There is no fee to register. Certification renewal is required every three years.

Qualified partners needing access to [NC SPARTA \(WebEOC\)](#) for enhanced situational awareness and support of statewide efforts will be provided access as requested.

- Registered vendors providing critical services, essential commerce, and necessary goods for the health and safety of citizens.
- Approved companies are issued re-entry certificates every three years. Certificates may be printed, copied, distributed and displayed as required.
- During an event, local authorities determine the order of access into restricted or curfew areas. Categories are: Life, Health Safety, and Economic Wellbeing.
- Once a level of restriction is entered or changed, registered companies in the affected area receive notification by email automated through NC SPARTA.
- Re-entry certificates exempt vendors from curfew and restrictions. MOA required. Note: local law enforcement may re-route vendors to their locations based on public safety considerations.
